**Subject: North East Industrial and Investment Promotion Policy (NEIIPP), 2007-
registration under the Schemes.**

Sir,

As per provision of the Central Capital Investment Subsidy Scheme, Central Interest Subsidy Scheme and Central Comprehensive Insurance Scheme under NEIIPP, 2007 issued on 27.07.2007 for the manufacturing sector and on 21.09.2007 for the service sector, read with amendment notification dated 12.09.2007; an industrial unit eligible for subsidy should get itself registered prior to commencement of commercial production.

2. Since some units could not get themselves registered under the said Schemes till 27.07.2007 / 21.09.2007 due to delayed notifications of the Scheme, this Department had permitted such units to get themselves registered under the above subsidy scheme latest by 31.12.2008 vide letter No. 10(5)/2008-DBA-II/NER dated 25.08.2008. It is further clarified that claims submitted by such units within one year of registration, could be deemed admissible for subsidy, if the State Level Committee deems the case fit for condonation of delay.

3. The Department has received several representations, seeking further relaxation of condition of pre-registration of units desirous of availing subsidy under the NEIIPP, 2007, beyond December 2008. Matter has since been considered and this Department is of the view that the condition of pre-registration of the industrial units with the State Industry Department prior to commencement of commercial production/ substantial expansion is important for determining eligibility/ quantum of subsidy under the Scheme. As such, a blanket waiver is not expedient.

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4. Any request for subsequent waiver shall be dealt with on a case to case basis. The SLC would recommend such relaxation, after conducting enquiry regarding actual date of commencement of operations by the unit, duly supported by relevant documents like Entrepreneurs Memorandum Part II filed by the entrepreneurs to the DIC. Final decision in the matter shall rest with DIPP.
